

Visiting Assistant Professor in Asian American Studies, Northwestern University

NORTHWESTERN UNIVERSITY invites applicants for a full-time, non-tenure line, 2-year position as a Visiting Assistant Professor in the Asian American Studies Program. We seek a candidate to teach courses in Cultural Studies (including Asian American popular culture and media), both general and advanced seminars on topics emerging from their research areas, and the Introduction to Asian American Studies course. Responsibilities include: teaching six quarter-length courses annually with possible course reductions for additional service; program building; and collaborating with Asian American Studies students and faculty. This is a benefits eligible, full-time appointment starting September 1, 2018. Ph.D. is required by the start of the appointment. Preference will be given to candidates with teaching experience and who have demonstrated experience working with diverse student communities.

Applicants should submit a cover letter, CV, a statement of teaching interests and philosophy, two sample syllabi, names and email addresses for three references, and teaching evaluations (as well as other relevant evidence of teaching effectiveness) at asianamerican.northwestern.edu. Review of applications will begin on **April 13, 2018** and will continue until the position is filled.
